Course Content

"Just and green: labour's ecological question" is a multi-disciplinary online course offering in-depth analyses of the different aspects of the 'jobs vs. environment dilemma' and its social and political implications. The course looks at various labour's struggles from across the world to resist environmental degradation and overcome this dilemma.

Through various academic contributions and labour-related policy proposals, as well as through the interaction with their peers and the instructors, the course offers the participants a platform to think critically and debate the necessary fundamental transformations in the ways we produce, consume and organise our economy and society.

Course Requirements

This is a multi-disciplinary course at the level of a Masters' programme, but the concepts are explained in an accessible and well-illustrated way, so it is also possible to participate in the course using skills and knowledge acquired outside formal education. The course requires a working level of English.

Learning Objectives

1. At the end of the course, the participants will be able to state key facts related to greenhouse emissions, including their unequal distribution across countries and social groups.
2. The participants will be able to discuss the underlying issues of the jobs vs. environment dilemma and provide concrete examples from across the world and sectors.
3. They will also be able to define and relate to key concepts in the environmental-labour debate.
4. The course participants will also be able to analyse and compare the merits of different analytical approaches and policy proposals related to the labour-environment topic.
5. Finally, at the end of the course, the participants will be able to assess related policy proposals.

Learning / Teaching Techniques

This course combines pre-recorded video lectures and published academic and journalistic articles with more an active engagement of the students themselves. This includes responding to exercise questions, posing discussions questions to other course participants and responding to questions by other participants.

The course uses also a range of interactive methods such as workshops with the course instructors as well as online discussions with other course participants and online tutors.

Quiz questions are also used to deepen factual knowledge and analytical skills.

The student was assessed according to the following criteria:

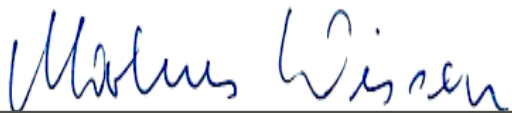
1. Watch all the videos
